LOCATION AND FACILITY

1) Where is the Meeting located?

3) How do I get to the Albuquerque Marriott Hotel?

The Albuquerque Marriott Hotel is just nine miles from the Albuquerque International Sunport (ABQ) airport. Travel by car is less than 20 minutes, depending on traffic. Various transportation options from the airport [are available here](#).

4) What are the hotel's amenities?

As noted above, all who choose to register with the room block for the ICSJWG Meeting will utilize the government per diem rate for their stay. The following is a list of hotel amenities available to those registrants:

GENERAL ICSJWG QUESTIONS

9) What is the ICSJWG?

The ICSJWG is a collaborating and coordinating body that provides a vehicle for communicating and partnering across all critical infrastructure (CI) sectors between federal agencies and departments, as well as private asset owners/operators of industrial control systems (ICS). The primary goal of this body is to continue to enhance the collaborative efforts of the ICS stakeholder community in securing CI by facilitating and accelerating the design, development, and deployment of secure ICS.

10) Where can I find a copy of the agenda?

11) Can I take pictures or record speakers and/or their presentations?

No. We ask that you do not attempt to take pictures and/or videos of presenters or presentations. Some presenters do not wish for their materials or presentations to be available for wider dissemination without their permission. Presenters will expressly state at the beginning of each presentation whether they allow photos or videos of all or part of their presentations (e.g., contact slides).

12) Does the ICSJWG publish a list of the Meeting attendees?

No, we will not publish a list of attendees following the Meeting. The ICSJWG encourages participants to network during the event and gather any contact information that may be of interest.

13) How can I provide feedback on an ICSJWG Meeting?

We greatly appreciate all feedback so that we can continue to improve the ICSJWG and the Spring/Fall Meetings. Yes. The Program Management Office (PMO) issues a Call for Abstracts prior to every ICSJWG Meeting, and interested speakers submit abstracts for their proposed presentations during this time. ICSJWG will notify interested speakers/presenters if we select their presentation for inclusion in the

Meeting. Speakers also have the option to have their abstract considered for a webinar presentation.

Webinars offer an opportunity for the ICSJWG membership to actively participate and communicate ideas, tools, and relevant information in an open forum. SLIDES AND PRESENTATIONS

19) Will the slides of ICSJWG presenters be available?

We encourage all participants to contact the presenters at the meeting to request copies of the presentations in which they are interested. The ICSJWG can coordinate the exchange of contact information between presenters who consent and those requesting presentations. Please send requests for slides or presentations to ICSJWG.Communications@hq.dhs.gov. Individual presenters have the final say on whether to disseminate their slides. The ICSJWG PMO will not post presentations to the ICSJWG web site or forward the presentations of individual speakers.

20) Why does DHS not disseminate its slides?

As a rule, the DHS does not release its slides to the public. This policy exists to guard against manipulation and misrepresentation. DHS/NCCIC provides numerous resources on its web site that are available for download, e.g., Year in Review Reports, Alerts, Advisories, and Monitors.
