



## CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

### Abstract Submission Due Date – March 8, 2019

The Industrial Control Systems Joint Working Group (ICSJWG) welcomes the submission of all types of abstracts related to Industrial Control Systems (ICS) security and resilience across critical infrastructure in all sectors. Our intent is to organize the agenda based on the subject matter represented in the abstracts included, after review and ranking by the ICSJWG Steering Team. To that end, the agenda will provide a limited number of presentations suitable as an introduction or overview of critical infrastructure and control systems. The remaining sessions are expected to be in-depth and technical, with take-away information useful to the attendees. *Abstracts submitted for presentations, panels, and demonstrations must reflect the actual material to be presented during the meeting.* Presenters should be prepared to answer ad hoc questions about the materials and to offer the materials to the attendees for their use, either as a presentation package or as a summary of the information.

The ICSJWG is particularly interested in abstract submissions that address examples of exploits found, with associated mitigation efforts and subsequent recovery activities; Asset Owner/Operator best practices and future plans; signal and intelligence efforts (unclassified) to determine new threat vectors; and development of tools for addressing internal and external threats. We continue to look for those speaking to cutting-edge or innovative examples of mitigation techniques, application of U.S. and International security standards, risk prioritization methods, migration or transition examples, and emerging threats.

### Submission Details

Presenters may submit abstracts for more than one presentation or type; *however, each submission requires its own form.* The ICSJWG Steering Team (IST) will review all abstracts (exempting those for the Vendor Expo) and make recommendations for inclusion in the agenda. The ICSJWG Program Management Office (PMO) will contact authors of accepted abstracts and provide a Speaker's Guide containing additional information.

**Note: The ICJSWG PMO reserves the right to schedule any chosen abstract as it deems necessary for the agenda.**

**Submit applications for the Vendor Expo using the form below.** The ICSJWG PMO will accept applications until the venue space is filled. We currently have 15 booth spaces available. A Vendor Guide, with details of arrangements to be made with the hotel regarding reserving booth space, will be forwarded to accepted applicants.

## Session Type Descriptions

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Evaluations and comments from previous events have supported the categories of presentations that we have listed below. Panels, demonstrations, and other presentation types that allow for question and answer (Q&A) and participation by the audience are highly encouraged.

### Presentation

Presentations are intended to highlight key issues of importance to the ICS community across the spectrum of security and resilience for ICS. All presentation submissions should provide information that is notable, timely, relevant, actionable, and engaging. Presentations may be broad or narrow in focus, technical or nontechnical. The duration of a presentation slot is typically 45 minutes, including 15 minutes for Q&A.

### Panel

Panels are intended to highlight key issues in a more interactive format than presentations. Panels should consist of a moderated, engaged discussion and/or debate about an issue critical to the ICS community. Typically, panels are limited to a 45-minute time slot, which includes Q&A time for the audience. To meet the allotted time, panels have up to four panelists and an additional moderator.

### Interactive Demonstration

Interactive demonstrations provide presenters with the opportunity to display new tools, techniques, and methods in ICS security. Demonstrations should be approximately 30 minutes in length, with an additional 15 minutes of Q&A and/or hands-on use of the tool, technique, or method. These types of events may require additional coordination and preparation among facility components, the PMO, and the presenters.

### Lightning Round

Lightning Round talks are brief presentations that last from 10 to 15 minutes, with a hard cutoff at 15 minutes. Three lightning round presentations are grouped together to fill a 45-minute time slot. Lightning Rounds are designed for challenging topics, proposed solutions, innovative ideas, emerging or ongoing research, or any other proposed topic of the presenter's choice related to ICS. The 15-minute cutoff for Lightning Round talks is strictly enforced to allow each of the three presenters their full allotment of time.

### Topic Specific Sessions

We are requesting speakers to specifically address several general topics, suggested through past evaluations. These Topic Specific Sessions can be in any of the described presentation formats. These are typically expected to be of a more technical nature.

If your presentation will address one of the specific topics listed below on the form, we ask that you select both the type of presentation and the specific topic on the form. If your abstract does not address one of the specific topics below, select only the type of presentation.

**Selection of a Topic Specific Session is not required and all abstracts will be evaluated by the IST for inclusion in the Agenda. Selection of a Topic Specific Session does not increase odd of selection.**

**Presentations or panels formatted as marketing or sales pitches for a company's services, capabilities, or products will NOT be approved.**
